The officers constitute the Chair, Vice Chair, Secretary, and Treasurer, who are collaboratively responsible for governing the activities of the chapter and work to achieve its goals. They form the executive committee, which includes the chapter officer. The members of the committee take office on the first day of the fiscal year and serve for one year.**

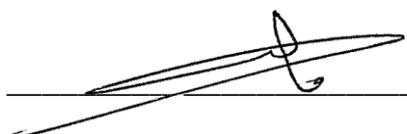
