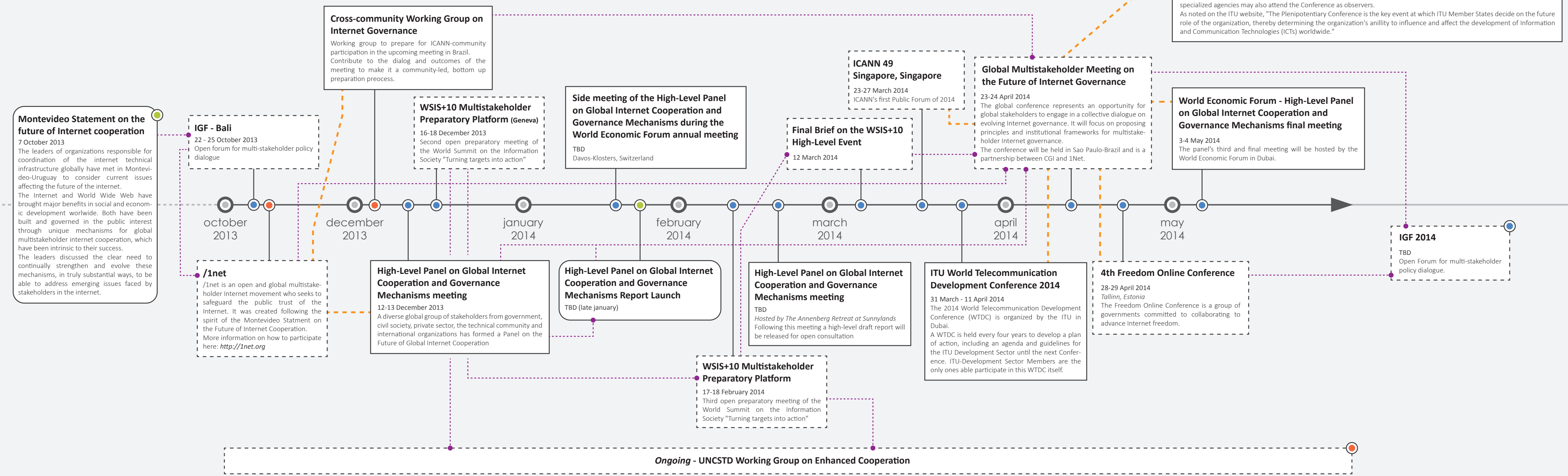


Global Key Internet Activities towards the Global Multistakeholder Meeting on the Future of Internet Governance



ITU Plenipotentiary Conference
 20 October - 7 November 2014
 Held every four years, the plenipotentiary is considered the top policy-making body of the ITU. During this session, Member States set the ITU's general policies, adopt four-year strategic and financial plans, and elect senior management and other officials. ITU Sector Members, Regional Telecommunication and Intergovernmental Organizations, and the United Nations and its specialized agencies may also attend the Conference as observers. As noted on the ITU website, "The Plenipotentiary Conference is the key event at which ITU Member States decide on the future role of the organization, thereby determining the organization's anility to influence and affect the development of Information and Communication Technologies (ICTs) worldwide."
