Leadership Positions Available

Board of Directors

ICANN's Board of Directors exercises the powers of ICANN, controls its property and conducts or directs its business and affairs. Directors are duty-bound to act in what they reasonably believe are ICANN's best interests and not as representatives of the entities that selected them, their employers or any other organizations or constituencies. Directors are expected to support the ICANN mission and the pursuit of ICANN's core values.

At-Large Advisory Committee (ALAC)

The ALAC considers and provides advice on ICANN activities related to the interests of individual Internet users. ALAC members may be individuals or may represent not-for-profit or profit entities, but key is that they are individuals. The Committee chooses five ALAC members, one from each of ICANN's five geographical regions: Europe, North America, Africa, Asia/Australia/Pacific and Latin America/Caribbean.

Country Code Names Supporting Organization Council (ccNSO)

The ccNSO is a policy development body that develops and recommends to the Board global policies for country code top-level domains (ccTLDs), develops consensus across the ccNSO's community and coordinates with other ICANN supporting organizations, advisory committees, and constituencies. Other ccNSO activities include developing voluntary best practices for ccTLD managers, assisting in skills building within the global community of ccTLD managers, and engineering operational and technical cooperation among ccTLD managers.

Generic Names Supporting Organizations Council (GNSO)

The GNSO is a policy development body that develops and recommends to the Board substantive policies for generic top-level domains (gTLDs). The GNSO Council consists of various constituencies representing particular groups of stakeholders and manages the GNSO's policy development and administrative processes. The GNSO constituencies choose most of the Council members, while the Nominating Committee chooses three Council members having staggered terms.
