ICANN's Contracted Parties House has approved the proposed amendments to the registrar and registry contracts to deal with Domain Name System (DNS) Abuse. This includes definition of DNS Abuse, specific obligations to take action against domains being used for DNS Abuse, recognising that contracted parties should take reasonable care in selecting and implementing mitigation activities, etc.

APRALO Policy Forum Update

After a rather hectic September-October schedule of APRALO/ICANN Meetings, the APRALO Policy Forum (APF) returned to its regular scheduling and delivered 3 key events in November and December.

APRALO ICANN78 Readout, 9 November 2023

APF organised an interactive ICANN78 Readout. The speakers were, **Maureen Hilyard** (APRALO), **Shita Laksmi**, ICANN78 Fellow, **Jennifer Chung** (GNSO), **Russell Woruba** (GAC-PNG) and Atsushi ENDO, ccNSO. Moderator **Cheryl Langdon-Orr** (APRALO) invited each panellist to elaborate on their takeaways from ICANN78. They also discussed with the forty-five event participants how individual end-users or APRALO could play a role in actioning some of those takeaways. Panellists clearly shared a sense of camaraderie when speaking about their engagement at ICANN78, encouraging participants to join in meaningful dialogue, as equal stakeholders across the AP Region. Key observations: need to deepen a common understanding & voice for stronger regional representation and engagement in ICANN governance, DNS operating policies and sustainability, support for the next AP-located DNS Forum, and presence of APRALO Members at the ALAC's 20th Anniversary Celebrations.



APRALO Policy Forum Updates contd..

Webinar #2 on Next Round of New gTLDs: A Primer on Applicant Support, 23 November 2023

In response to feedback received during the <u>2 APF Town Hall Planning sessions</u> held in August 2023, the APF kicked off a webinar series around the New generic Top-Level Domains (gTLD) Program. Following Webinar #1 which provided an overview of the Program, particularly from the At-Large perspective, we conducted Webinar #2, which focused on the Applicant Support Program (ASP) of the New gTLD Program. Thirty-four Webinar #2 participants got to engage with **Justine Chew**, the former At-Large Liaison for Subsequent Procedures, and now the ALAC-appointed member to the Subsequent Procedures Implementation Review Team (SubPro IRT) as she reviewed the learnings on the ASP implementation in the 2012 round of New gTLD application and spoke to the ICANN Board-approved consensus policy recommendations on ASP expected to be implemented ahead of the next round's target launch date of Apr 2026. We're pleased to note that this webinar series continues to draw some interest from non-APRALO Members.



APF Fireside Chat #3: Let's Talk About Internet Fragmentation, 7 December 2023

The 4th APRALO Fireside Chat featured a conversation between **Jia-Rong Low**, ICANN Vice President, Stakeholder Engagement and Managing Director - Asia Pacific, and **Justine Chew**, APRALO Policy Forum Chair, about Internet Fragmentation. Thirty six participants joined the conversation in gaining a common understanding of Internet Fragmentation, its potential impact on ICANN and individual end-users, in respect of ICANN's mandate and any wider role in Internet Governance. Jia-Rong deftly explained ICANN's narrow remit in the global Internet infrastructure space and discussed ways in which the end-user community could support the protection of the publicly available, globally interconnected Internet against fragmentation. Participants found this conversation useful and felt that it should be an ongoing one, as challenges in keeping fragmentation at bay continue to arise due to various reasons including geopolitical pressures, and a lack of understanding by key stakeholders, all of which potentially lead to unintended consequences impacting the Internet as a global resource.

F2F meeting of the members of the Expedited Policy Development Process (EPDP) on IDNs - Satish Babu

The Expedited Policy Development Process (EPDP) on Internationalized Domain Names (IDNs) met in Kuala Lumpur from December 6-8, 2023, aiming to refine IDN variant policies for upcoming new generic top-level domains (gTLDs). Divided into two phases, the project addressed top-level issues in Phase 1, with its report submitted in November 2023.

This meeting primarily focused on expediting Phase 2, centered around registry-specific concerns in managing second-level domains. While highly productive, discussions in Kuala Lumpur left one issue unresolved: aligning IDN tables. However, they confirmed implementing four Phase 1 principles at the second level. Additionally, they opted for an Expert Working Group model for IDN Implementation Guidelines v4.1 due to consistent security and stability implications across gTLDs and ccTLDs.

The Phase 2 report's final language is expected by mid-February 2024, followed by a public comment phase, seeking input from the At-Large community in CPWG meetings.

ICANN NomCom Report - Maureen Hilyard

The new ICANN NomCom team met for the first time at an Onboarding session in Hamburg and together we set goals for important NomCom tasks for 2024. At-Large has 5 members on the NomCom. The others are Seun Ojedeji (AF), Alfredo Calderon (NA) Betty Fausta (EU) and Lia Hernandez (LAC). We also have former ALAC member, Naveed Bin Rais, representing RSSAC, and Amir Qayyum who is the Chair of this year's NomCom. For 2024, the positions that are being offered are for the ICANN Board (3), ALAC (2) and one each for the ccNSO and GNSO Councils. We encourage anyone who believes they fit the position descriptions to apply. More information as it comes to hand.









Final Update on the GNSO Guidance Process (GGP) on the Applicant Support Programme – Maureen Hilyard.

The GGP Working Group held its final meeting on 4 December 2023 and sent its final report, following a call for public comment, to the GNSO Council for their vote of approval at their December meeting. The ALAC was represented on the cross-community GGP Working Group by APRALO members, Maureen Hilyard and Satish Babu. The recommendations in the GGP report cover a range of issues that could impact on what information and resources could be made available for applicants who may seek help or their applications during the next round of new gTLDs.

ALSes could play a significant role in getting important messages about the applications process out into their communities. The key target group for this next round of support will be potential applicants in regions which are currently underserved by ICANN and/or the wider domain name industry. More information about the imminent applicant programme and any related support, will become available, from the Implementation Review Team and the GNSO. Operations Finance and Budget Working Group Update - Shah Zahidur Rahman

The OFB-WG is finalising the process for receiving At-Large funding request and including the same into the ALAC's response to the Draft ICANN FY25 Operating plan and Budget which is open for public comment.

All Funding Requests, should be submitted by 7 January 2024 along with detailed explanation on the purpose and scope of the proposed activity, its alignment with the ICANN mission and strategic plan for fiscal year 2021-2025 and ALAC strategic priorities. In addition there should be clear demonstration on how the proposed activity is related to ongoing or anticipated ICANN and ALAC policy work and will impact the whole At Large community (either in terms of policy position and/or advice development, operations, or engagement such as capacity building activities that are aligned with the ALAC's strategic priorities)

At the WG call an update on the ICANN Grant Program was presented by Shayna Robinson, Grant Program Director, ICANN Org. The grant program will open in the first quarter of 2024. The Grant project details, for the first cycle is USD 10 million, while the Grant awards will range between USD 50,000 up to USD 500,000 with Maximum duration of projects is 24 months etc. For more details visit: https://community.icann.org/pages/viewpage.action?pageId=132940946

The eighth edition of the Asia-Pacific School on Internet Governance (APSIG) was organized in Manila, Philippines, during 27-29 Nov 2023, with a Day 0 on 26 Nov 2023. The local hosts for the event were ISOC Philippines and BluePoint Foundation.


A total of 37 Fellows from 18 economies, including 11 Local Fellows from the Philippines, participated. Apart from the five members of the APSIG Executive Committee, other resource persons who were present onsite included Edmon Chung (ICANN Board/DotAsia), Srinivas Chendi (APNIC), Gunela Astrbrink (ISOC Standing Committee on Disability), Waqas Hasan (APrIGF), Winthrop Yu (ISOC Philippines), Aris Ignacio (ISOC Philippines), Engels Antonio (BluePoint Foundation), Magie Antonio (BluePoint Foundation), and Noelle Francesca de Guzman (Internet Society).

Remote presenters included Yien Chyn Tan (ICANN), Aftab Siddiqui (Internet Society), Edmundo "Toti" Casiño, Michael Caster (Article 19), and Justine Chew (ALAC, ICANN).

Three persons with disabilities were selected as Fellows (Ms Manique Gunaratne from Sri Lanka, Mr Vidhya Yella Reddy from India, and Mr Eshaq Shahin Bhuyan from Bangladesh).




Webinar on What is UA and UA Day? -Shreedeep Rayamajhi, Rayznews

Rayznews, in association with Learn Internet Governance and ICANN Circle, organized an interaction program with the Universal Acceptance (UA) vice chair Nabil Benamar to discuss the importance and priorities of UA in our communities.

The UA became a crucial topic in developing economies where communities had multiple languages and dialects. Promoting one's language and facilitating dialogue became a major challenge at the local level, particularly in regions where English served as the standard and primary means of communication.

The event, held on December 20, 2023, from 9-10 UTC, marked an opportunity for participants to engage with Nabil Benamar on these vital aspects of Universal Acceptance. The significance of UA in accommodating diverse linguistic landscapes and fostering inclusive communication was explored, addressing the challenges faced in regions with linguistic diversity.
