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At-Large Welcome Session

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EPDP and GDPR Compliance

- Advise ICANN Board to reject the SSAD recommendations.
- Policy recommendation that Legal/Natural field be added to RDDS/WHOIS.
- Consumer protection is the At-Large priority.
- ALAC will respond to Public Comment on the EPDP Initial Report, and advise the ICANN Board on EPDP.



Reputation Block Lists

- A little like credit scoring.
- Widely used.
- No standards.
- Inconsistent findings.



ICANN Multistakeholder Model

- Processes for progress evaluation must include quantitative measures.
- Regular progress reports must include initiatives undertaken by At-Large Structures (ALSes).
- Structural/power balance issues need to be identified and addressed.
- PDP 3.0 needs careful attention to participant balance during its initial implementation stages.



Subsequent Procedures

- Promote <u>ALAC advice to ICANN Board on Subsequent Procedures</u> (16 April 2021). Any expansion of the New gTLD program must be beneficial to all stakeholders.
- PICs and RVCs must be enforced by ICANN Compliance, and/or removed from contract if no intent to enforce.
- ICANN must suspend all Closed Generics applications until GNSO provides consensus policy recommendations on those serving the global public interest.
- More resources needed for Applicant Support Program.
- Recommend Notification Tool for GAC Members who wish to be informed of any application regarding GeoNames.
- Do not support private auctions.



Transfer Policy Review PDP

- System is overly complex.
- End user experience should be paramount.



Virtual Meetings

- Thankful for bandwidth subsidies.

DNS Abuse

- New policy on DNS abuse mitigation must be put in place prior to a new round of New gTLDs.
- Ransomware, including phishing techniques with fake system identifiers, is on the rise.
- At-Large is committed to individual end user education, and agreedupon definition of DNS abuse (vis-a-vis content abuse).
- At-Large focused on registries and registrars with HIGH percentages of abuse registrations.
- At-Large supports the SSAC recommendations, including SAC114 and SAC115.



Universal Acceptance

- 80% of websites are non-compliant.
- Undermines ICANN credibility.
- UA issues must be remediated prior to ANY new round.
